Overview

Bulli High School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are Wellbeing Assemblies, Stymie, Orientation and Transition programs, Skittles and Individual Behaviour Support Plans.

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Bulli High School has the following school-wide rules and expectations based on our values of Respect, Responsibility and Integrity:

Bulli High School Core Values

RESPECT

Students have regard for themselves and others, authority and diversity and accept the right of others to hold different or opposing views.

Students who are respectful:

- Treat others with dignity
- Follow all staff instructions: "First time, every time"
- Speak, listen, and behave courteously
- Co-operate with others
- Are aware of others' personal space
- Develop positive and respectful online and face-to-face relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, abilities, and culture of others
- Take care of property
- Care for our school and local community environment





RESPONSIBILITY

Students are accountable for their actions towards themselves, others and the environment.

Students who are responsible:

- Attend school everyday
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Are prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Adhere to the mobile device policy by turning their phone off and leaving it in their bag from gate-togate
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

INTEGRITY

Students are consistently honest and trustworthy.


Students who act with integrity:

- Model and follow school and class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Dress appropriately by following the school uniform code
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous and harmful behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous and harmful behaviour
- Support and celebrate the success of others
- Show courage as upstanders

Bulli High School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

- Strong teacher/student relationships.
- Explicit teaching and modelling of specific skills including behaviour expectations and social skills.
- Communication with parents around school expectations.
- Class based systems of expectations and positive reinforcement.
- Consistent teacher expectations, routines, modelling and responses to behaviour.
- Curriculum links, particularly in PDHPE (including respectful relationships), and personal and social capabilities in all syllabi





- Liaison with previous teachers, pre-schools, external paraprofessionals
- Social skills programs, role play and drama activities, and circle time.
