
## Principal's report

#### The extra bus

I received word last week that Transport for NSW is not prepared to support a bus to Helensburgh. Naturally this was very disappointing news. Thank you to all who completed the survey regarding bell times. Over 500 people responded and overwhelmingly in favour of a change. I did state at the time, that any change was subject to the extra bus being put in place, so at this stage the start and finish times will remain unchanged.

#### Resource Allocation Model (RAM)

Since 2014, the NSW Government significantly increased its investment in schools so funding flows directly to the students and schools that need it most. The Government was guided by the Gonski review, which found that school funding allocations should be fairer, equitable and more transparent, based on individual student need.

To deliver needs-based funding to every NSW public school, a Resource Allocation Model (RAM) has been developed. The model strategically targets resources directly to schools, allowing principals to use the funding to improve the quality of teaching and improve student results.

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The information in the 2017 Planned School Budget Allocation Report will support our school to develop our budget and allocate funding to deliver on the strategic directions in our school plan. The school executive will continue to work with our school community as we implement our school plan.

#### NSW Education Symposium 2016: Future Reform Directions for NSW

Last week I attended the Education symposium in Sydney which was hosted by the Education Minister, Adrian Piccoli. I joined local and international thought leaders from academia, school education and business. The symposium facilitated the different sectors of education working together to develop new insights on systematic school improvement, and explore possible future reform directions. It was an honour to attend and was very thought provoking and motivating.

Once again this is a bumper edition of our newsletter and a showcase of what our students and staff continue to achieve.

We look forward to meeting you as you join our Bulli High School Community.



#### **Science**

We have started the examination period for our junior years. The dates are as shown below. Students must bring all equipment – pens, pencils, ruler, eraser and calculator. Year 8 also have the VALID test (as detailed in the last newsletter) and they require earphones for this test. The VALID test period is from  $2^{nd} - 11^{th}$  November. We have locked in today - Friday  $4^{th}$  November (8 E, L, S) and Monday  $7^{th}$  November (8 N, O, V) as our proposed dates assuming that there are no technological issues.

Completion of Semester examinations definitely does not signify the end of the coursework! Year 7 and 9 will continue with their Living World module, moving on to the Ecology topic. Year 8 will complete the Chemical World syllabus and then some of the classes will learn about Machines and others will do a Lifestyle Science topic. Year 10 classes will complete a Forensic Science module or will undertake extension Chemistry work. This will keep us busy all the way to the end of the term!

Year 11 have settled into their Year 12 coursework. To be successful in Science subjects at HSC requires a consistent approach to revision and consolidation of the coursework. All our subjects are rich in content and a deep knowledge and understanding is required for a high band result. We advise that students read and learn their notes and then begin to refine their examination technique by responding to past HSC questions.

Marine Studies have begun their unit of work on Snorkelling and are reminded to bring their gear on the days nominated by their teacher so that they can go and practise their skills. They also have the opportunity this term to go on an excursion to Bass Point as part of this particular module of work.

On the subject of excursions, the trip to Melbourne in the last holidays was a great experience. Following is the report & photographs.

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#### **The Year 11 Science Excursion to Melbourne**

In the second week (Tuesday to Friday) of the last school holidays, a group of 8 very keen Year 11 Science students went on an excursion to Melbourne. I was fortunate enough to accompany them along with Mr Ken MacKenzie and Andrew Dipuglia from the University of Wollongong. The trip was organised by Associate Professor Michael Lerch from UoW and Ms Lang.

We stayed in the centre of Melbourne and visited a variety of scientific venues in the area.

These are the places that we went to:

- School of Biomedical Sciences, Monash University
- The Australian Synchotron
- The Melbourne Centre for Nanofabrication
- The Physics Department, Melbourne University
- The Peter MacCallum Cancer Care Centre

At each venue we were taken for guided tours by people who worked there, often a very senior person within the establishment. The students were able to ask questions, handle some of the equipment, involve themselves in practical activities and listen to PhD students talk about their work. They also were given advice regarding study patterns for particular career paths and descriptions of certain jobs within the different fields of Science.

We also went along to the Melbourne Museum and spent a couple of hours looking at the extensive range of exhibits.

The students said they all really enjoyed the whole experience and were very enthusiastic about what they had learned. Mr MacKenzie and I also had a great time and would like to thank all the students for their company!

It was a fantastic opportunity for the students to see so many scientists at work and be able to see the wide variety of employment opportunities available in these particular areas of Science.

We would especially like to thank Dr Lerch for his help in organising the trip and for allowing Andrew, one of his PhD students, to accompany us. He is a regular visitor to the Australian Synchotron and was able to share the details of his work with us when we were there. We aim to organise more of these excursions in the future!



#### **HSIE**

On Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October, eight students from 10B Geography attended the Global Goals Youth Forum, held at the Nan Tien Temple by the Asia Education Foundation. Students prepared for this by looking at the 17 United Nations goals for 2030, including eliminating poverty, discrimination against women and climate change, and chose a goal area in which to specialize. On the day, they joined students from a range of schools in the Illawarra and beyond, including Smith's Hill, TIGS and Illawarra Sports High School. The wearing of uniform was discouraged in order to facilitate mixed groups of students to implement the Design Thinking process in order to create, test and present solutions to the challenges presented by the UN goals. Bulli High students Miranda Du Toit, India Goss-Maher, Sienna Hawksley, Monty Josh-Jones, Cliodhna Maguire, Alexandra Murphy, Mara Peterson and Mikayla Pountney collaborated in teams with like-minded students, and four of them led their team's presentation.

Overall, it was a thought-provoking and inspirational day. It was an absolute pleasure to see this fine group of Bulli High School representatives in action, and reinforced what excellent role models they are. I thank them sincerely for their interest and participation, and extend my thanks also to Mrs Gregory and Mrs Hawksley for their assistance in getting the group to and from the venue.



Earlier this week, Ms Reichhart and Mrs Hicks accompanied 10HISN and 10HISR to the Sydney Jewish Museum. The visit was in addition to classwork on the Holocaust. The group had the privilege of listening to Yvonne Engelmann a survivor of Auschwitz. Yvonne's testimony was an honest, open account of her life including the treatment of Jews up until liberation from the war. It was an emotional account that had a huge impact on the students understanding of the Holocaust. Many students were left teary by the talk. The group also attended a thought provoking lecture on 'Choices' as well as a visit to the Anne Frank exhibit. It was an inspirational day with all students displaying courtesy and respect. On behalf of all staff and students, I wish to congratulate and thank Ashleigh Donald, Alinta Maguire, Shanae Streeter and Kara Tuck for their outstanding contribution to education and culture at Bulli High School. These four girls have conducted themselves over the past six years with integrity and respect. They have been responsible for helping and attending all cultural events that have been offered. Kara and Alinta have been working with elders on a school mural, which will remain a legacy long after they have moved on. We wish each of you the best in your future ambitions.




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#### **Maths**


