This is an area of student wellbeing that we are committed to further developing.

In 2017, under Robyn Lang's guidance, the Developing Leaders Program will commence. Three teachers from the Seacliff CoS will be working togther to implement a program that will involve students from Bulli HS and a small group from each primary school. The project is funded by the Thirroul Lions Club and allows time for the three teachers to get together to plan and organise the training days which will be held at BHS. Participating students will then lead a project in their respective schools. This is a fantastic opportunity to develop student leadership at Bulli HS in collaboration with our 9 partner primary schools.

Enrichment Class 2018

Students in Year 6, 2017 will be able to apply for one of two Enrichment classes for Year 7, 2018: The STEM class or the Arts class. We are introducing the second class in response to the continued demand and high calibre of past applicants. The two Enrichment classes will follow the same curriculum pattern as all students in Year 7, however each will have a unique focus which aims to further cater to the strengths and talents of students. Students will still sit the test and participate in the interview process. Application forms are available from Bulli High School Administration Office, the school website: www.bulli-h.schools.nsw.edu.au and our local Seacliff Community of Schools. For more information, see the flier later in the newsletter. We believe these changes will further enhance the Enrichment classes for students.

HSC Results

We eagerly await the HSC results which will be released to students and schools on Thursday 15th December. Students may contact the HSC Results Inquiry Centre – 1300 13 83 23 after results are released. The service offers a valuable opportunity for students to talk with experienced BOSTES staff who are able to answer questions about their HSC results or the systems behind determining and processing them.

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Gonski Funding

Bulli High School has utilised the funds received this year to provide teachers with release time to support student learning, to purchase furniture for the library which has enhanced the reading area, purchase blazers which are readily available to all students representing the school, to fund a teacher mentor for our Aboriginal students, to fund a teacher to work with faculties to cater to the individual needs of students, to fund Student learning Support officers to work with individual and small groups of students, and to develop our school leaders through the Growth Coaching leadership course. We are currently reviewing the last year of our current school Plan 2015 - 2017 and hence our expected expenditure of the 2017 funding.

School Security

Bulli High School is recognised under the *Enclosed Lands Protection Act*. No one has the right to be on the school grounds without permission. As a community member we are asking for your assistance with keeping our school secure by:

Mr Nousis will be missed for his passion for teaching and absolute commitment to his students. We also farewell Mr Phillip Holmes (Science) and Mrs Karyn Evans (LOTE) who are both retiring from full time permanent teaching positions. Both Phil and Karyn have been long standing, highly regarded members of our school and we wish each of them all the best in their retirement and thank them for their dedication to Bulli HS. We may see Mr Holmes and Ms Evans back completing some casual teaching next year.

Parents & Citizens Association

Our P & C led by president Mrs Barbara Brown, has worked tirelessly throughout the year to support the school and I thank them for their efforts, time and commitment to supporting our students and staff. I look forward to working with this wonderful group again next year. In particular, I can announce that in 2017 the Inaugural Post Card & Art Show will be held over the June long weekend. More details will be announced in the new year.

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Daily Break Times 2017

Next year there will be a slight change to our daily break times. We are swapping the short and long breaks so the first break, Recess, after Period 2, will be the longest at 45 minutes with Lunch after Period 4 being 25 minutes. In total students will still have the same amount of free time each day as they do now. This allows greater access to the canteen, and more time to get a drink, eat lunch and use the toilet facilities. Most students and staff eat breakfast before 7.30am each day, and at present have to wait until 1.20pm for a decent break. It will also mean students are outside for less time in the hotter part of the day.
