Year 7 Enrichment Class Showcase

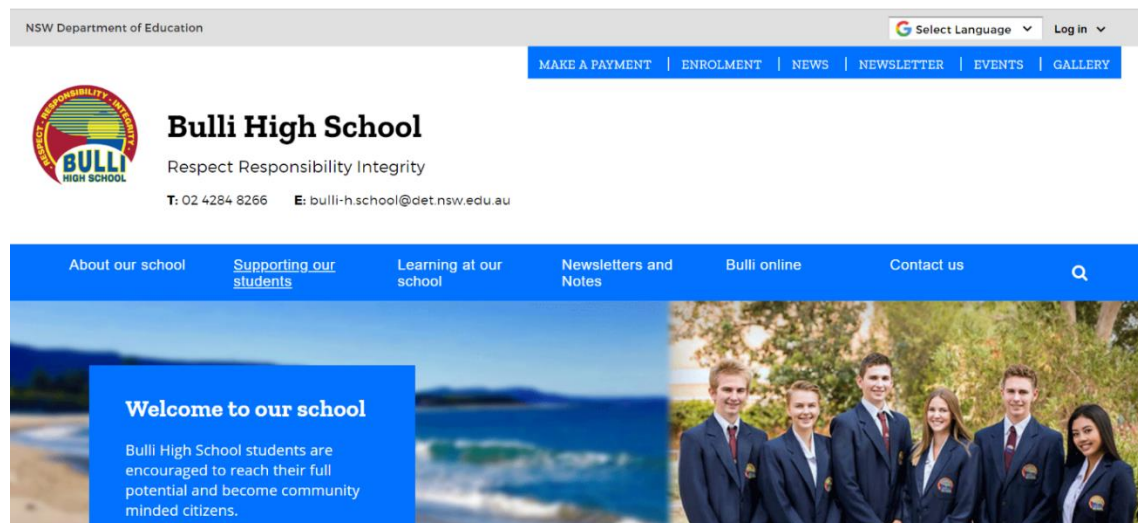
Thursday afternoon was a fantastic display of student learning. Bulli High School enjoyed sharing the achievements and learning of 7R and 7S with parents and families.

Thank you to Mr Broadhead for the following fantastic news. Congratulations Mason!

Mason Broadhead, currently in Year 7 at Bulli High School, attended the New South Wales Basketball State Championships in Maitland over the weekend with his U14 Illawarra Hawks. Going into the weekend, his team were 27-0 having won the Southern Junior League, Country Championships and the Country Championships League.

On Friday, they played Hills Hornets winning 49-30. Saturday morning, they beat Penrith Panthers 68-26, in the afternoon they beat Gosford Rebels 73-36. Sunday morning, they beat Blacktown Storm 49-35 to set a showdown in the Grand Final with the undefeated Sydney Comets. The Grand Final was a tight affair with the Hawks going on to win the State Crown 57-51. In the Grand Final, Mason scored 7 points including a pressure three pointer.

Judah Kami from Year 8 will be added to the squad and the boys will now turn their attention to the National Club Championships in Kilsyth Victoria where they will fight it out for the Australian Crown.



YEAR 8

Year 8 students will be undertaking the Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID) test between **29th October and 9 November 2018**. This compulsory test takes approximately 70 minutes. The VALID Science test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer. It examines both knowledge and skills from the Science Stage 4 syllabus. Earphones or headphones are required so please ensure that your child has a set that they can use.

Dear Year 8 Parent or Carer

The *Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development* (VALID) test for Year 8 students will be held between **Monday 29 October** and **Friday 9 November 2018**. The test takes approximately 70 minutes. The **VALID Science 8** test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer.

VALID Science 8 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 4 outcomes and essential content in the *NSW Science Years K–10 Syllabus*. Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science and technology.

Since students complete *VALID Science & Technology 8* on a computer, each student needs to bring **headphones or earbuds** that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact your child's school to discuss special provisions or possible exemption from the test.

Results of the test will be available during Term 1 2019. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personal report for each student will be sent to parents/carers to describe the science knowledge and skills demonstrated by the student in the test. There will also be information about how your child's results compare with overall performance of all students in the test.

The principal of your child's school is able to provide you with more details about the VALID program if you require additional information.

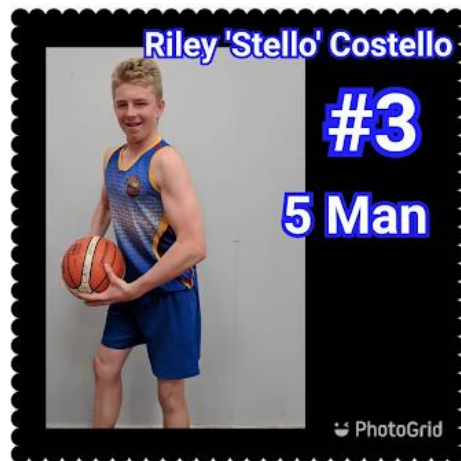

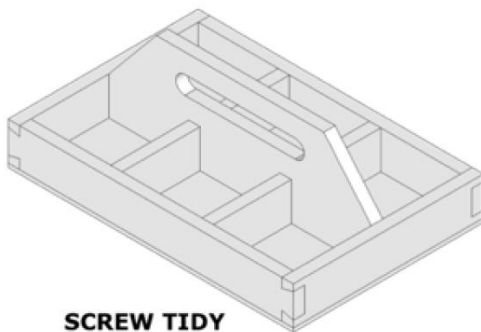

Crossroads Excursion: Road Safety Education

CROSSROADS EXCURSION: ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION

KEMBLA GRANGE: 28 AUGUST 2018

On Tuesday 28 August, 117 Year 11 students from Bulli High School boarded a bus and headed south to Kembla Grange for a day of Road Safety Education in association with Rotary Youth Driver Awareness (RYDA). The students were divided into two groups and rotated through a series of six workshops where they were made aware of a number of issues facing young drivers. The workshops included:

- an inspiring talk by a crash survivor with a spinal cord injury who generously shared her story
- a demonstration of stopping distances and how these are significantly affected by speed
- hazards and distractions and managing these as a driver and passenger
- awareness of personality and mindset with regard to driver and passenger safety
- a discussion about the key risk areas for young drivers and passengers
- 'Genevieve's Story' where students analysed a real crash, its contributing factors and the development of plans for decision making in risky situations

All workshops were interactive and included filling in relevant sections of a booklet. The completed booklet will be a useful and relevant resource as these students begin to gain experience on the road both as drivers and passengers. Also included in the booklet is a tear out certificate of attendance as well as a unique identification number whereby the students can enter a draw to win a prize. Students are encouraged to do this as soon as possible to be in for a chance to win.

Our students were a credit to Bulli High School as they demonstrated engagement and interest in the content, followed teacher and facilitator instructions and wore their full school uniform.

Thanks is extended to Mrs Green, Ms O'Connell, Mr Donnelly and Ms Pidhirny who accompanied the students for the day and to all staff at school who covered classes.

Seven new school zone traffic offences

To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic infringements with new fines.

None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

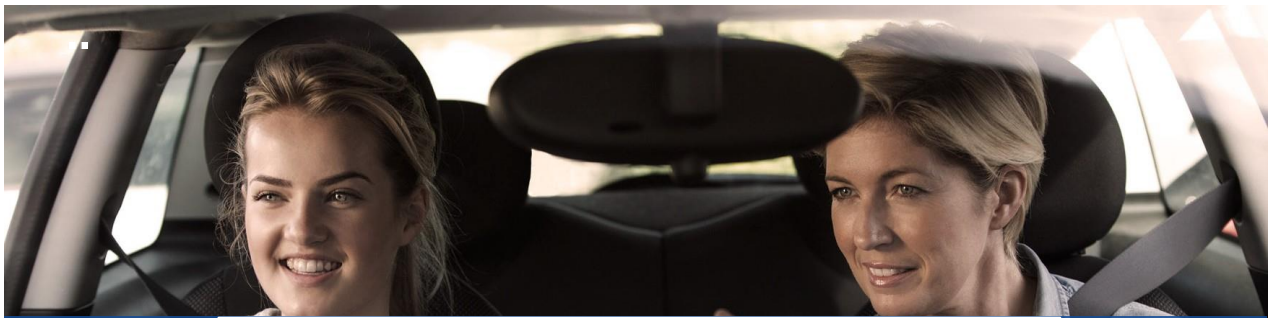
1. Stopping in intersection - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
2. Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
3. Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
4. Stop near bicycle crossing lights - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
5. Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
6. Not parallel park in the direction of travel - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
7. Parallel park close to dividing line - Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
